Dear friends,

When Jesus appears to his disciples there is a four fold common action in his revealing of himself. First, is often the words "peace be with you," then something that proves his resurrection. In today's gospel Jesus eats some fish to show his real physical resurrected body. Jesus then often opens the minds of the disciples to the fact that this was planned long ago and indeed all the scriptures, what we now refer to as the Old Testament, points to this event and are the fulfilment of all God's promises to his people. Finally Jesus commissions the disciples to bear witness to what they have seen and to make disciples of all nations.

To be effective in our own baptismal commission to bear witness to Jesus, we often need to experience the first three movements of Jesus in reverse order. Our spiritual engagement with the scriptures through the Holy Spirit make real the resurrection which brings a sense of peace that enables us to proclaim the resurrection and salvation in Jesus.
