**“This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.”**

Dear friends,

After the miracle of the feeding of the 5000 Jesus has to escape into the hills to stop the people from leading a revolution and forcing him to be king. The people were aware of the stories of old and saw in Jesus' actions as one who was like the prophets of old. The messianic figure expected by the people of God was one who many thought would purify the land from the pagan occupiers and make it holy once again.

The modern day Jewish Seder meal still carries something of that expectation as a place is set at table, but unoccupied, for the returning prophet Elijah.

Jesus also echos Moses and the bread from heaven in the wilderness. Manna was gathered each morning and as Ex16:18 tells us 'he who gathered much had nothing over, and those who gathered little had no shortage.'

Jesus, as the true bread from heaven, holds back nothing and lived out on earth what he gives us in the Eucharist - everything, body, soul and divinity. In response to this generosity of God we surely must learn to hold nothing back from him and our love of our neighbour?
