“She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus...”

Dear friends,
It has struck me this year more than most how all our readings seem to constantly repeat, especially in gospel according to Matthew, how this mystery of the Nativity was to fulfil a purpose promised long ago. Isaiah, ‘The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. It is this: the maiden shall be with child.’

The clue to what that purpose is is revealed in the name that the archangel Gabriel repeats to both Mary, in Luke, and Joseph in Matthew. They are both told quite clearly that the boy born to Mary must be named Jesus, the same name as Joshua in the Old Testament, and it means Saviour.

However, we need to ask; What are we to be saved from and how? Gabriel in his announcement to Joseph states, “he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.” At the very basic level sin is anything that separates and stands in the way of our relationship with God. The longing of the human heart is to know the embrace of our Heavenly Father. Sin has caused a rupture with that communion of being we are made for - the enfolding love of the Lord.

Alienation since the Fall has been our normal mode of operation, but God would not abandon us and a part of the ‘how we are saved’ is found in the second title of Jesus as Emmanuel - ‘God is with us.’ Our salvation by the Saviour didn’t begin at the Cross but was set into motion at the Incarnation. God shares in our humanity that we might be able to share in his divinity. The babe in Bethlehem, the house of bread, reconciles in himself heaven and earth. The beginning of this mystery of our journey of salvation found in the new born baby in the crib, seems to me something worth celebrating!
