To summarise his response, he basically said that: 'The sense of humanities self confidence and certainty, the thought that we were master of all that we survey, our certainty of economic growth, that we could control all things and more assertively boast of our independence of any other, has been shaken to the

This illusion has be shattered by a tiny virus. This small virus has woken us up rudely to the reality of our vulnerability. Life is beautiful, vibrant, and full of possibilities but is also fragile and fleeting. This virus has brought us face to face with the reality of our need of interdependence in the light of our mortality.'

Without God life becomes hollow, a fleeting moment that could be snatch away at any time. This sense of despair has the tendency to lead to hedonism, selfishness and fatalism.

We have had to face the fact that death is a certainty that none of us can escape. Our only hope is to acknowledge our need and dependence on God. In God alone are we able to face death and make sense of the otherwise meaninglessness of human existence. He is our Alpha and Omega, our beginning and our end, all life flows from God and returns to him.

Christ has shown in our celebrations over this Holy Week and Eastertide, that he alone has been able to face death and overcome it. The bodily resurrection of the God/man Jesus, reveals that death is unable to contain or withhold him. In fact our Lord's entering into the place of the dead was to bring to liberty those held in the captivity of death.

It is Jesus who has risen again and leads the way for those who look towards him. It is in the acknowledgement of our need of union and dependency upon him that begins to shine a light of understanding and hope in the midst of such a crisis that we face.

As St Paul so powerfully puts it in Romans 8:35-39

'Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, " For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.'
