Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the greatest mystery of the Christian faith. God has revealed himself as the Holy Trinity - One God in the three persons of Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. This complex mystery of God shapes the Church's character, identity and liturgical life.

As Christians we are invited to contemplate and enter into this mystery of God as he has revealed himself in the incarnation of Jesus Christ and present in the Church as the Holy Spirit. We are baptised in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Indeed we cannot be truly a Christian without belief in this self revealing nature of God.

Obviously the complexities of this understanding of God is a mysteries that we cannot fully grasp and certainly is not accessible by human reason alone but requires the gift of faith from God. Yet it is not mere idle theological speculation because what we understand about God impacts on our self understanding as we are made in his image and likeness.

Reflecting upon the three persons of the one God we realise that we are not made to be alone but in relationship to another. It is in relationships that we become more complete and self aware of who we really are. The Trinity also shows that diversity and oneness are natural and not incompatible to each other.

The Church is Catholic, universal and is made up of people from many different cultures and liturgical practices. It's unity is founded upon the belief of the one God who has revealed himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
